

Crystal's Story ...

Hello, my name is Crystal Lena Stinson and I am 33 years old and I'm going to tell you about my journey to Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home. A journey that will forever be in my mind and heart and that I can't wait to tell my little Anna Marie about. Right before coming to BGMH I was in a four month Residential treatment program which marked the start of the beginning of my new life; my clean and sober life. After finishing the program, I had planned, like all the other girls who had finished the program successfully, would continue to Mather transitional living program. Two days before leaving the program I was told I was going to BGMH, a place I had already put out of my mind because I had been on the list since I started the program, but every time I ask about it they say it is still full. Now that I finished the program I looked forward to going with the close friends I had made to Mather: So when they told me I was going to BGMH because of my high risk pregnancy I was really hurt and upset.

When they dropped me off I had made up my mind I wasn't going to like it instead of realizing it was God's plan for me. Grandma Lenore was the first person I met who kindly showed me to my room where all I did was cry. Then I met Miss Anita, she asked me to hop in the van with her and go for a ride. She said any time you're sad just hop in the van with me. I couldn't help but smile at that kind woman.

A few days later I was at an event downtown called Recovery Happens; I found myself walking through Cathedral Square when I looked up and all around me were these

posts with signs on them that said Bishop Gallegos. I instantly got chills; I did not know that he had his own little square and surely not a coincidence that I found myself on it. I knew right then I was where I was supposed to be, right where God wanted me to be at BGMH. Three days later, September 5, 2015, I gave birth to a beautiful baby girl who I named Anna Marie, a name that just came to me after I saw her. The name I planned all along was Lillianna, but when I saw her, she was Anna Marie. She stayed in the NICU for 3 weeks for monitoring because of medication I had to take while pregnant. After three weeks



they said she was doing well and was ready to go home. Less than a week later I noticed something seemed like she wasn't well, she was hardly eating anything & looked pale & grey. I called her doctor on Sunday; she said she couldn't possibly be grey and that NICU would have caught it if anything was seriously wrong. She said if I was still worried to come in on Monday. I hung up and called my friend to come right over, I was taking her to the hospital. I didn't care what the doctor said.

I knew something was wrong within minutes of them assessing her. More doctors starting coming in, all of a sudden it was a full room of doctors, nurses and two Cardiologists doing an ultrasound of her heart. I couldn't understand all of their medical terminology but I did catch it was congestive heart failure. I started freaking out; I had this horrible knot in my stomach. It seemed like forever before they explained to me that she had a rare heart defect called

"total anomalous pulmonary venous return". The doctor said if she didn't have surgery the next day she would die. Bringing her to the hospital saved her life. I knew I needed to be stronger than ever. When I had time to leave the hospital for a few minutes; I rushed home to BGMH. As soon as I walked in the door Sylvia was right there and right way, knew something was wrong. She hugged me and asked what was wrong; I could hardly speak from crying. I finally was able to say Anna was going to have open heart surgery and without it she would not survive, and even *with* surgery she might not make it. Sylvia ran and got Grandma Lenore. As I told her what was happening she too hugged me and told me she was going to make some phone calls for prayer. By evening there was an entire army of people praying for Anna Marie. Grandma Lenore also said I should have her baptized before surgery. Two hours before surgery Ann Marie had a full baptism. The five hours she was in surgery were the longest hours of my life, but somehow I knew she was going to be alright and when the doctor came out he let me know how much of a miracle she truly is. The surgery went better than expected because he explained that when a baby with her condition has waited this long to have the surgery that they would expect her to have some obstructions to her heart, but she didn't have any. She was in the hospital only a week and a half where she made a full recovery. I've had so much support from everyone at BGMH, support and love and now I truly know why God wanted me to be here at BGMH was to save Anna's life. This has been a journey that will forever remain in my heart and mind!
